



## CINA Quality Suite™ CMS Qualified Registry for PQRI Reporting

CINA is proud to be a qualified CMS registry for the **Physician Quality Reporting Initiative (PQRI)** and as such, can report measures on behalf of the provider, to CMS on an annual basis for participation in PQRI reporting. Registry reporting using CINA obviates the need for reporting PQRI codes on a “per claims” basis, and thus significantly increases the reporting success for the provider.

Below are a few of the highlights of the **CINA PQRI Registry** system.

**One-time annual submission**—no more need to match PQRI codes to specific claims

**Electronic data extraction**—CINA utilizes advanced technology to electronically extract data elements needed for data submission directly from your EMR or Practice Management System (PMS) and moves these data elements into a standardized central data repository (CDR). From here, CINA performs the data analysis necessary to determine the appropriate numerators and denominators for reporting.

**No provider intervention required**—CINA utilizes advanced technology to electronically extract data elements needed for data submission directly from your EMR / PMS and moves these data elements into a standardized central data repository (CDR). From here, CINA performs the data analysis necessary to determine the appropriate numerators and denominators for reporting. Thus, PQRI reporting using CINA takes place completely “behind the scenes”.

**No manual data entry**—CINA’s electronic data extraction techniques mean that no one has to manually enter any data elements.

**Reporting on the population as a whole**—CINA’s electronic data extraction also means that it is just as easy to report on all eligible patients seen during the year as to report on a subset of patients. CINA utilizes the “minimum of 3 measures, minimum of 80%” reporting rules—although most of the providers for 2008 reporting submitted on average 10 measures each.

**Reporting on a wide range of applicable measures**—Once again, using CINA’s electronic data extraction it is possible to report on as many measures as are applicable to the eligible patient population. This provides the practice with a much richer data set for internal use and practice improvement.

**Full spectrum of measures available**—CINA reported on over half of the available measures in 2009, spanning the breadth of primary care and many specialties. CINA will incorporate all of the new measures for 2010 that are applicable to its client base.

**Experience and Accuracy**—CINA’s business offerings center around the process of data extraction, standardization and reporting—all functions required for PQRI reporting. Additionally, CINA has been reporting PQRI data measures since the inception of the program in 2007.
